





Site development:

- Created staging areas.
- Installed temporary power.
- Installed offices and temporary crushing plant.

Dam surface preparation:

- Removed the spillway crest.
- > Gave the dam a "facelift."

Foundation excavation:

- Started excavation of new dam abutments.
- > Removed foundation rock.











Recreation closures:

- South side of Gross Reservoir closed for the duration of the project.
- Periodic closures of Fisherman's Parking Lot because of heavy traffic.


North Shore:

- ➤ Parking lot redesign was completed in 2022 and helped improve access to the shoreline at the North Shore.
- Implemented a shuttle program to assist people with getting to the water.













Continuing work:

- Continued site development.
- > Dam surface preparation.
- Dam foundation concrete placement.

Additional work:

- On-site batch plant, which will process concrete for the dam raise.
- On-site crusher plant to process rock material for dam concrete













Intersection improvements:

- Relocating the current CO Highway 72 and Gross Dam Road intersection.
- Improving intersection geometry and sight lines permanently improves safety for residents, visitors and workers.
- On schedule for June 30 completion.
- Once complete, all projectrelated vehicles and deliveries will use this as the primary route to the site.







Gross Dam Road roadway improvements:

- Widening tight curves on Gross Dam Road to allow two trucks to pass on the curve.
- Grading narrow sections of the roadway.
- ➤ Work is ongoing and should be complete by the fall of 2023.


